# The Egg and You

### Read this draft of a student's report and answer the question(s) below.

(1) Which came first, the chicken or the egg? (2) There may be no correct answer to this <u>old</u> riddle. (3) But if we ask which one prehistoric humans first ate, the answer is almost certainly the egg. (4) The ancestor of today's plump chicken was a scrawny and unappetizing bird. (5) But eggs then were just about as appealing and nutritious as they are now. (6) They were also the easier of the two to get.

(7) Today, eggs are still one of the most universally consumed foods. (8) Eggs are also one of the most versatile foods. (9) They serve as binders and thickeners in baked goods and processed foods. (10) They also contain most of the important dietary minerals. (11) Eggs <u>are used</u> in dishes ranging from dense and creamy custards to soufflés.

(12) But although the egg has remained one of the staples of our diet, in recent years its healthfulness has been called into question. (13) Scientists are constantly questioning the healthfulness of foods like white flour, fried potatoes, and even chicken liver. (14) Some nutritionists have raised concerns about the high level of cholesterol in eggs. (15) Other scientists have pointed out the danger of food poisoning if eggs are not cooked

to the proper temperature.

(16) Despite such concerns, eggs are rated as having an extremely high nutritional value. (17) They not only provide all of the amino acids needed for growth, but also all of the essential vitamins except vitamin C. (18) All of these good things come wrapped in an elegant and compact shell containing only 80 to 100 calories.

(19) Given its nutritional value and versatility, it would be a shame if consumers eliminated the egg from their diet entirely. (20) Eaten in moderation, and cooked with a little care and common sense, the positive qualities of the egg far outweigh any potential health risks for most people. (21) Eggs could simply be gathered, but chickens and other fowl could fly away from the primitive hunter. (22) So don't be chicken—scramble up an egg for breakfast!
